Course Attendance

Several Group Leaders have commented to me recently that members who have enrolled on their courses are not attending regularly. This has already resulted in one course closing as the leader felt, quite reasonably, that, despite the course being fully subscribed, having only two people turn up each week (and not the same two) it was not worth running the course.

Course leaders put a great deal of time and effort into preparing their courses, and they do so voluntarily, so if you have signed up for a course, please make every effort to attend every session. If the course is one of progressive learning, e.g. a language course, by missing sessions you are also holding up the rest of the group members if the leader has to go over previous work to enable you to catch up.

Some members are also enrolling on courses which clash with each other (either deliberately of accidentally) and attend each one alternately. This is very unfair to those who are on waiting lists and would be able to attend every session. Where I have spotted this on enrolment I have asked that only one course is chosen, but it is individual member's responsibility NOT to choose courses which clash, so if this is the case for you, please consider relinquishing your place on one of them, particularly if there is a waiting list.

If you are unwell, and really can't make it try and let the leader know, and also give some indication of how long you will be missing for, as depending on the course, this could allow someone from the waiting list to be offered some sessions.
